Archbishop Wilson nominates the family as a key focus for 2020 Summit

Australian Catholic Bishops Conference President, Archbishop Philip Wilson, said he was honoured to have been selected to take part in Prime Minister Kevin Rudd's 2020 Summit and that family life and the well-being of people would be his key focus during the discussions.

Archbishop Wilson was named as a participant in the section of the Summit entitled "Strengthening communities, supporting families and social inclusion".

"This is an honour and a great opportunity to be able to sit down with people from a wide cross-section of the community and listen to them and engage in a robust dialogue of ideas and values," he said.

"I'll be giving prayerful and thoughtful consideration to the key issues ahead of the Summit to inform my contribution in the best way possible, with a special focus on the development of family life in this nation and the well-being of its citizens."

Mr Rudd has convened the Summit, to be held at Parliament House, in Canberra, on April 19 and 20, to help shape a long term strategy for the nation's future.
